





Data Processing Technology






Special projects are a part of every art class. It may range from painting to wire sculpture. JoLynn Loving is shown at the right taking painstaking care with her project.


Mr. Castillo, another language instructor, teaches classes in French and Spanish in the evening school.

Students spend several hours per week in the language lab in order to perfect their conversational skills.




Science




Mrs. Graef, a chemistry teacher, assists Mike Thomas in choosing the right chemicals for an experiment.


English












Education and Psychology

Mr. M. B. Johnstone, in addition to his duties as Director of the Evening School, instructs classes in Geography and Education courses.




Mr. Shaw, Psychology instructor, listens to Mr. Rogers as he discusses the role of the Church and today's social problems.



This group of intent and alert psychology and so-ciology students are listening to Mr. Rogers' discussion on the role of the Church in social problems.








Speech

Being a good listener, as well as a good speaker, is necessary in Speech. Terry Gibson listens intently as another student delivers his speech.




Being able to be a good speaker in front of an audience is the main objective of the Speech classes.

At the right, Nellie Roberts learns how to administer a blood test by practicing on a fellow student.




Nursing students learn the many facets of nursing in practical situations. Below, students are learning how to turn over a bedridden patient easily and comfortably.








